The scope is working well, but when using the go-to feature, objects appear slightly up and to the left of center as you look in the eyepiece and usually need to be re-centered. The written directions specify you should start the scope and then move it to the "east" as an initial move. Instead of doing this, search for and go-to any object that you are positive is high in the sky and it works fine.
